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

Mass Casualty Incident (MCI)

- A mass casualty incident (**MCI**) is defined as “an event that overwhelms the local healthcare system, where the number of casualties vastly exceeds the local resources and capabilities in a short period of time.”

Plan Objectives

- The HCC demonstrates the ability to enhance situational awareness for its members during an event
- The HCC has demonstrated resource support and coordination among its member organizations under the time urgency, uncertainty, and logistical constraints of an emergency
- The HCC can Report Essential Elements of Information
- The HCC has a process to enhance its member's situational awareness to support activation of immediate bed availability through continuous monitoring

Regional Capacity MCI Plan

- Rapid Assessment of all regional hospitals
- Tiered approach
- Real time information to the field and system situational awareness
- Includes Job action sheet, script, and log



Regional Capacity MCI Plan

- Or Call 252-847-7777 (ECU Health Operations Center) and request the Pt Placement Facilitator to begin the MCI Regional Capacity Assessment
- Activation will occur in the medical center
- Assessment of hospitals
- Report back to onscene command
