OVERVIEW






- A branch within the Epidemiology Section of the NC Division of Public Health

Strategic National Stockpile - Purpose

- Designed to supplement and re-supply state and local public health agencies during a public health event in which state and local assets have been or will be depleted
- To save lives and prevent illness

What's a CHEMPACK

Containers of nerve agent antidotes placed in secure locations in local jurisdictions around the country to allow rapid response to a chemical incidents.






NC CHEMPACK Locations

Expanding medical services to handle large events










Plans, Training, Exercise, and Evaluation
