

Emergency Programs Division

- NCDA&CS State Lead for Emergency Support Function 11
 - Agriculture and Natural Resources
 - Nutrition assistance; control/eradicate animal/plant disease outbreak; food safety and security; protect natural/cultural resources; provide for the safety and well-being of household pets
- Coordinate Department preparedness, response, and recovery activities
- Incident Management
- Information Support Services
 - Technology development and support, GIS, information management

- Administrative Staff


In large events, fill ICS roles: Command, Liaison, Operations, Planning, Finance, Logistics



Preparedness Activities

- ➤ Develop and conduct Emergency Operations Plans (EOPs), Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs), training, exercises specific to agriculture response
 - Foreign Animal Diseases such as Avian Influenza, African Swine Fever, Foot and Mouth Disease
 - Natural Disasters
 - Chemical, Biological, Radiological, Nuclear and Explosives (CBRNE)
 - Agroterrorism







Preparedness

- Maintain emergency response equipment and supplies
 - CAMET and CAST
 - Depopulation units (swine and poultry)
 - Decon units
 - PPE
 - Miscellaneous response equipment from other Divisions including access to helicopters, military surplus high-water vehicles, dozers, tractors, backhoes, refrigerated trailers





Response - Key NCDA&CS Divisions

- **NC Forest Service** incident management, chainsaw crews
- Veterinary animal health issues related to response and recovery
- Agronomic Services information sharing on storm damage to crops
- Food and Drug Protection flood damage and power loss to food processors, stores
- Food Distribution mass feeding, Food commodities, transportation
- Meat and Poultry Inspection flood damage and power loss to meat processors

- NC State Fair staging area for responders and equine sheltering support
- Marketing facilities for staging and equine sheltering support
- Plant Industry nurseries and plant disease response
- Research Stations staging for assets and response to issues on farms
- Soil and Water Conservation debris management in streams, creeks and hog lagoon
- Structural Pest Control and Pesticides flooding or damage to pesticide storage facilities

- Web-based tool development and support





Companion Animal Group









- Work with local and state partners and national NGOs
- Daily coordination calls with partners
- Coordinate animal search and rescue
- Find personnel and supplies for collocated shelters
- Coordinate movement of CAMETs and CASTs

Livestock Group

- Prediction maps before landfall
- Daily coordination calls with industry groups (swine, cattle, equine)
- Delivering hay, feed, generators
- Assisting with animal rescue
- Fencing repair



Poultry Group

- Prediction maps before landfall
- Daily coordination calls with industry
- Foam depopulation
- Gather reports of mortality



Mortality Management Group

- Coordinate clean-out and composting operations on commercial animal farms affected by natural disasters or disease outbreaks
- ➤ Monitor biosecurity during disposal activities
